The Glenrowan District community hope to achieve a plan that links the community and develops the district.

Profile

Glenrowan and Glenrowan North residential precincts and immediate environments are home to approximately 1,000 people. The Glenrowan North precinct includes the Hamilton Park and Grant housing estates, as well as other residential development in the area. Located on both the Melbourne/Sydney main road and rail corridors, the Glenrowan Township nestles in Rowen's Gap, the pass that separates the Warby and Futter Ranges almost midway between the provincial cities of Wangaratta and Benalla. Residents of Glenrowan and District are the symbolic keepers of many of the myths and legends associated with the exploits of the iconic bushranger, Ned Kelly. The township precinct supports businesses that attract tourism visitation as well as services to support the local community. The Glenrowan and District Community Centre at the Recreation Reserve incorporate the Memorial Hall. These facilities host many sporting and recreational activities, while the Multipurpose Centre supports young and older people activities. The Glenrowan Primary School is a significant part of the community.

Hamilton Park was established as a cooperative in the early 1970s when Doug Hamilton subdivided 150 acres into one acre lots. Currently, there are 104 houses in the estate and an adjoining 20 houses in Grants Estate. The residents hold working bees to continually improve and maintain facilities, such as tennis courts, walking tracks, and arboretum. Residents are connected through social activities held at the picnic area, market days and a newsletter. The Board of Management are keen to progress the need for a community facility to provide more activities for residents, particularly the families

Background

The Glenrowan community gathered on the 19 October 2008 to review the priorities from the "Celebrating Great Glenrowan" community document which was developed in 2006. A community planning meeting was held on Sunday 17 October 2010 to identify the needs and aspirations inclusive of Glenrowan North and Hamilton Park that would inform and shape their district Community Plan. This is a list of identified needs generated from a brainstorming session held on 13 October 2010:

TABLE ONE

Interpretive Centre located within the town
Youth – skate park in Lions Park, there is nothing for youth Primary/High School age children, need local centre, vacation times, mentor program, guidance, need local YMCA, Scouts & Guides, need school crossing at Beaconsfield Parade as well as Warby Range Road, more school parking, staff to park elsewhere so parents have priority parking, bike path to continue past school towards Benalla on Old Hume Hwy, footpath alongside Anne Jones Inn site, Beaconsfield Parade needs to be maintained, grass covering path, no room for prams, bikes, single file walking only is unacceptable, repair and fill holes at Primary School carpark, Lions Park needs tables & drinking fountain, why aren't all the historic sites and buildings, homes, etc signposted with plaques, info? A walking tour with map could keep people here longer than an hour or two, tourism grant could reveal previous unknown hidden gems in Glenrowan Township, Better signage and directions to Caravan Park, Scout Hall to be revamped: fantastic potential for smaller groups to use, public hire for celebrations, toilets, heating, painting, parking,

gardens, signage, outdoor lighting – bring back the Scouts!

TABLE TWO

Gladstone Street reseal – track into parking area especially, Public access to Mount Glenrowan, Extension of street scaping along Gladstone Street, Public access to toilets – disabled & coaches, remove bollards, Seige care park with public toilet, delination of car park and lighting, How to make good use of station building, Fosters toilet, Seige Capture Site needs memorial statue, Hill Street has problems with drainage and requires lighting between Beaconsfield Parade & Kate Street.

TABLE THREE

Recognition of Hamilton Park area – North East Victoria's best kept secret!
Water and sewerage availability a must in the future, Bus service to include Hamilton Park via Orchard Drive and Henley Road, Glenrowan Hall improvements to catering facilities, hall floor sanding, front entrance to hall needs upgrading, drainage & sealing driveway, Community activities facility at Hamilton Park Recreation Area, safety fence around Glenrowan Reserve dam.

These needs were then prioritised and champions (community members attending the meeting) nominated to progress the needs as projects which are detailed on the action plan attached.

The community were also asked how they could allocate a \$5,000 Community Planning Grant to a particular need in the community.

Allocation of 5,000 Community Planning Grant

scoped and a budget established.

The community identified the following projects:

- Bike path
- Incorporate community group for festival
- Reprint seige brochure
- Memorial statue competition
- Hard copy of Glenrowan Gazette
- Seal Gladstone Service Road

The attendees voted on whether to allocate the funds or delay:

Delay	17 votes
Now	5 votes

Therefore it was decided to postpone the allocation of funds until the group next gathering.

A workshop was schedule for 8 December but due to storms and flooding was postponed until 2011. The workshop was held on 6 April 2011 at the Glenrowan Primary School. Thirteen members attended and decided to allocate \$1,000 to the Glenrowan Gazette for hard copy publication and \$4,000 to the Kelly Country Festival, contingent on community Involvement. Discussion at a Kelly Country Festival Steering Meeting did not resolve the allocation of funding so a Community Planning gathering on the 28 June made the following decision:

\$2,500 allocated to the Glenrowan Indoor Carpet Bowls for sanding the Memorial Hall floor.

\$500 allocated to the Glenrowan Improvers to support the Seige Dinner event.

\$1,000 allocated to the Glenrowan Primary School to support the Grade 5 & 6 student drink fountain project. Council to hold the funds until the project is fully
