- Any Itinerant Trading without a Council Permit may incur a penalty under Local Law 1 – Council Amenity.
- Food Trading will require a Streatrader Food Premises registration.

STANDARD CONDITIONS FOR ITINERANT TRADING

From Clause 14 of Local Law No.1 of 2014 Community Amenity (Amendment)

Itinerant traders must not:

- trade within 300 metres of an established permanent business that is selling the same or a similar product
- trade within 500 metres of a Council approved festival without holding the appropriate permit or authorisation for that festival approved by Council
- restrict the flow of pedestrian traffic
- interfere with entry to or exit from any building or driveways
- obstruct any footway or roadway
