In deciding whether to grant a permit the Council or an Authorised Officer must consider:

- (a) the zoning of the property; and
- (b) the proximity to adjoining properties; and
- (d) the type and additional numbers of animals to be kept; and
- (e) the likely effects on adjoining owners; and
- (f) the adequacy of animal shelters; and
- g) any other relevant matter.

CONDITIONS

- The permit is issued to the person and property named in the application and is not transferable.
- The permit must be specific to the dogs/cats named in the application and substitution of, or for any dog/cat is not allowed and will require a new application
- All dogs and cats on the property must be registered with the Rural City of Wangaratta and be securely confined to your premises in accordance with the *Domestic Animals Act 1994*.
- If a permit is granted, it will be subject to review following receipt of any complaints from neighbouring properties
- Failure to comply with any of the above conditions could result in this permit being cancelled and/or penalties will apply as prescribed in the Local Law No.1.od 2014 Community Amenity (Amendment)
- An Animal Management Officer will attend and inspect the animals, and housing of the animals to ensure that the animals are kept in accordance with the *Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1986*, with adequate shelter, food and water and secured to the property in a manner to maintain safety of the animals and prevent nuisance to any neighbouring residents.
- Any excess excrement is disposed of in a manner to prevent odour, and in accordance with the *Public Health & Wellbeing Act 2008*.
