Important notes about objections to permit applications.

1. This form has been prepared to help you make a submission or objection to an application in a way which complies with the Planning and Environment Act 1987, and which can be readily understood by the Responsible Authority. There is no requirement under the Act for you to use this form.
2. Prior to completing this form, please make sure you clearly understand what is proposed before you make an objection. You should inspect the application by viewing the advertised plans on Council's website (www.wangaratta.vic.gov.au) or in person at Council's office located at the Government Centre on the corner of Ovens and Ford Streets, Wangaratta. Council's Building and Planning counter is open between the hours of 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday to Friday.
3. To make a submission or objection, you should clearly complete the details on this form and lodge it with the Responsible Authority as shown on the Public Notice - Application for Planning Permit.
4. An objection must:
 - (a) State the reasons for your objection, and
 - (b) State how you would be affected if a permit is granted.
5. The Responsible Authority may reject an application which it considers has been made primarily to secure or maintain a direct or indirect commercial advantage for the objector. In this case, the Act applies as if the objection had not been made.
6. Any person may inspect a submission or objection during office hours.
7. If your submission or objection relates to an effect on property other than at your address as shown on this form, please provide details of that property and of your interest in it.
8. To ensure the Responsible Authority considers your objection, it must be lodged by the date shown in the notice you were sent, or which you saw in a newspaper, or on the site.
9. If you lodge your objection before the Responsible Authority makes a decision, the Authority will inform you of its decision.
10. If, despite your objection, the Responsible Authority decides to grant a permit, you can lodge an appeal against the decision to the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal. Details of the appeal procedures are set out on the back of the Notice of Decision which you will receive. An appeal must be made on a prescribed form (obtainable from the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal) and accompanied by the prescribed fee. A copy must be given to the Responsible Authority. The closing date for appeals is 21 days of the Responsible Authority giving notice of its decision.
11. If the Responsible Authority refuses the application, the permit applicant can also appeal the decision. The provisions are set out on the Refusal of Planning Application which will be issued at that time.
